<b>Learning Objectives</b>	Draw an animal with an alliterative name. Write a poem using adjective alliteration. 
<b>Materials</b>	BICKIDS® Visa® Felt Tip Pens BIC Kids Mechanical pencil The attached worksheets 
<b>Lesson</b>	
<p><b>Complete worksheets 1 and 2</b>          Using BICKIDS® Visa® Felt Tip Pens and BIC Kids Mechanical pencil draw an animal with an alliterative name. Then complete the adjective worksheet.  <b>Medium difficulty:</b> Ask the pupils to think of a name for their animal that includes an adjective.</p> <p><b>Write a poem using adjective alliteration.</b>          Using the information created on worksheets 1 and 2, write a poem that includes examples of adjective alliteration. The poem must be about the animal the children have designed and include at least 4 adjectives with alliteration.  <b>For example:</b>          My <b>loud lazy Labrador likes</b> to eat <b>lasagne</b>  <b>She</b> gulps down the <b>slimly</b>, slippery pasta making her tail waggle faster.</p> <p><b>Advanced difficulty:</b> Adjective alliteration poem competition. Use the points system below to work out how many points each poem has. The person with the most points is the winner.</p> <p>Adjective = 5 points per word          Alliteration = 10 points for 2 words per sentence                            15 points for 3 words per sentence                            25 points for 4 or more words per sentence</p>	
<b>Learning Outcomes</b>	Understand what alliteration is and how it is used Use alliteration with adjectives Write a poem using both adjectives and alliteration
<b>Follow on Activities</b>	Create a 3D model of the animal using plasticine and then animate it introducing itself.

Alliteration happens when words with similar sounds or first letters are close together in the same sentence.

For example: 'She sells sea shells on the sea shore' and 'Edmund Elephant is excited'.
